We admire you for the courageous decision you have made to choose life for your baby and to look at all the options for securing your baby's future. We're Patrick and Denise. We want you to know that we are prepared to give your child a life filled with love and opportunity.

We've been happily married for many years and are looking forward to adopting a baby. When we were first told that we could not give birth to a child, we were heartbroken. Denise felt like a failure as a woman, especially after going through numerous and, quite often, painful infertility treatment procedures. But after thinking about what was important to us, we realized that loving and nurturing a child was far more important than giving birth. Adoption offers us a chance to realize our dreams and to give a child a wonderful life and bright future.



We live in a historical, seaside town in New England, rich in history and culture. Our home is near a beautiful ocean harbor filled with sailboats.
